The event, which began April 29, drew thousands of PTA members and delegates to Sacramento.

Besides the many presentations, events and workshops of the convention, crucial business of the association was also conducted, with the following actions taken by delegates:

A proposed **Legislation Platform** was adopted unanimously with no amendments.

Resolution A: Computer Workstation Health was adopted with one amendment.

Resolution B: Child Trafficking in California was adopted with no amendments.

Among the announcements made at convention were the California State PTA membership theme for the coming year: “PTA – Connected for Kids”; and the 2010-2011 Reflections Program theme: “Together We Can”
